Memorable moments:	 I was attached a Heavy Anti Aircraft Battery of the Royal Artillery on Radar. Our equipment was in large cabins well away from the gunsite. Two cabins which rotated – one sending out signals and one receiving them (R.T.). The signals were long distance and we relayed information to girls on predictors on the gunsite, who then relayed them to the gunners who manned the guns. We were a team of six and not allowed to mix with the others, as our work was highly secret. We did a six week stint relieving. I remember going to Anglesey, Bude Cornwall, Leicester, Lowestoft, Hull, Porthcawl and finally Pilning Nr Bristol. A couple in Hull regularly invited 4 of us girls for a super meal and a hot bath during the 6 weeks while we were there. A similar thing happened in Bude, Cornwall when the village Postmaster and Postmistress invited the 6 of us who were there up for supper once a week. We felt quite privileged being selected and allowed to go. My posting to Pilning was compassionate as I lived in Bristol and my mother was 			

	 ill – her condition was worsening. We were always in Nissen huts with round black stoves and a pipe going through the roof. The walls were always running with water. I enjoyed the marching and drilling but hated the P.T. so when we paraded for P.T. I managed for quite a while, to hide in the toilets, until more girls joined me and finally more girls were inside than on parade and we were discovered!!
