

Memorable moments:	 Rose joined the A.T.S. at the outbreak of war due to the only male member of the family becoming a conscientious objector. "If the men won't fight for the country then women will have to go!" Rose met and married her husband (serving with the R.A.S.C.) in three months, marrying at Weston-super-Mare on 29 June 1940. Later that day she was on a charge for not carrying her gas mask at the ceremony. Rose always said A.T.S. members were given the next size shoes up and marched into them! (She took a size 8.)
