Memorable moments:

- My team of Radar operators being on duty when Sir Stafford Cripps and several other attendants came to observe a new plane, called The Mosquito, being flown along the south coast to see how well it was picked up by the Radar, as the fuselage was mostly made up wood. He was told the signals were excellent. On the second run he was able to observe the plane through a small telescope attached to the side of the Receiver, and seemed surprised how good a view of the plane he had. He thanked us and left the site very quickly.
- Another day we had a visit from three Russian Officers to observe the gun-site and the Radar, or GL as it was called then. They were very friendly and interested, and kept waving to us as they left – one even blew a kiss!
- Some Canadian Officers came on a visit a few weeks later, to examine the site for some new equipment. When they left, we were given chocolates and biscuits – we hoped they would return soon!
