Memorable moments:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • My mother saw an advertisement in 1938 saying that 60,000 volunteers were needed for the army and decided to join up. • When on the gunsite at Chelsea, she had a flat near the Barracks. During the blackout she was accosted by a prostitute who was astonished that she was a woman. My mother always marched when she walked. • I was born in September 1940. I was sent to my grandmother. When I started school a V2 blew up the Church and School. My dad – David Smith – was killed 		

in Burma in 1944.

- After the war my mother met a Grenadier Guard. He had a dog and she kept it. He would come and walk the dog and we would walk with him. Then they would walk together and eventually they got married.
- My mother re-trained as a Clerk at the end of the war.
- She received a pension until the year she died.
